Best Practices for For-Credit Internships For Employers & Community Partners

Introduction:

San Diego State University works with many employers and community partners in providing safe, meaningful and productive for-credit internship experiences for students. This sheet provides a basic check-list of items that employers and community partners are encouraged to review before initiating contact with the University about a for-credit internship.

For-Credit Internships:

An informal definition of for-credit internships is as follows: For-credit internships require at a minimum clear relevance to an academic major offered at the University, a project that demonstrates a benefit to the student's learning experience, and meets the University's demonstrated need for planning regarding items such as confidentiality, emergency preparedness and ongoing communications with a University contact. Internships that are primarily clerical or mechanical do not qualify for academic credit. Also, note that internships that provide "free labor" to start or maintain a business do not qualify and may be in violation of the Fair Labor Standards Act.¹

Students looking to do an internship for credit usually will need a site supervisor who will be actively involved in determining projects that will make up the majority of the internship experience, work with a University contact to review the internship site, and provide feedback about the internship experience. To meet the academic component of the internship, students may be required to complete a journal, essay, or presentation to illustrate the knowledge and skills they learned.
